



- 1992 new constitution
- 1994 last Russian troops leave
- 2002 access to digital ID & signatures

Diplomatic passport holders abroad need to apply via the nearest embassy. Local diplomatic corps needs to apply through the Estonian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
